First Set of 2022 Classes Announced

The School of Christian Studies Digital Learning Initiative (DLI) has its own dedicated two-year schedule of courses with its own registration mailings and forms. You will no longer sign up for DLI classes through the regular course mailings.

It is now possible to take the School of Christian Studies three-year Pastoral Ministry program in two years through the DLI program. The schedule of courses for 2022-2023 is included with this mailing. Listed with each course is the open registration period, the date class begins, when course work is due, the last date course work is accepted and when grades are due to be given.

2017 DLI Pilot Program Students: You are not required to pay for the class, but please let me know which class you will be attending by e-mailing Donna at snyder@wvbc.org. If you need the textbook, you may purchase it by completing the form and mailing it back with a check for the textbook and shipping fee.

Current DLI Students: Please complete the form and mail back with your fee.

New DLI Students: If you haven't taken a DLI class with us, but would like to get started, please complete the form(s), don't forget to check the "First Time - Need Username and Password" section on the form(s), and mail back with your fee.

Your textbook(s), class schedule and login information, if needed, will be mailed as soon as your form and fee are received in the office. *The syllabi for Theology I (T-01), Evangelism (Mod-06) and any other material will be available online January 15, 2022.*

If you are unfamiliar with the School of Christian Studies' Digital Learning Initiative, please read the information below for an introduction.

The Digital Learning Initiative is a training program intended to provide quality instruction to pastors, pastors-in-training, church leaders and others by digitizing the three-year Pastoral Ministry program of the School of Christian Studies and making it available in a two-year format to persons who otherwise could not receive training because of scheduling issues.

First, class lectures, handouts and other content will be digitized and available to students in
electronic format (online), or upon special request, on a USB drive or SD card. The content of the
digital classes will include videos of lectures conducted by an experienced and skilled instructor,
current handouts and reading material, usually one book per class, but sometimes more. Students
interact with the material by writing papers, preparing lessons or sermons, and will interact with each
other by participating in digital discussion forums.

We pray this will provide a great way for students to receive a high quality, Biblical education from home.
