As I start to write my last article as your President, I am reminded of a parallel memory and the joy it brings me, even to this day. The memory is from when I was still working. I commuted over an hour each way daily for a period of ten years. During those long car rides, I listened to the "oldies" station and as the seasons changed so did the station's playlist. When summer came around each Friday from Memorial Day until Labor Day two songs were faithfully played, Summertime and On the Way to Cape May. Many Fridays I thought about how nice it would be to be going to the beach. I thought about all the happy times and the memories we had already created with family and friends. I had this internal longing and those songs reminded me of it. That longing was to be with and make memories with the people who were the very reason I made that commute and worked all those years. My work, commute and efforts were all toward an end of serving those I loved most. So, as I am winding down the last few months of this area of service, I am reminded of all of you that I have been privileged to serve alongside. Serving is a specific kind of work, work that indicates a direction. You can work without regard for others, but you cannot serve that way. Serving is labor for somebody else. It will make all the difference in the world today if you are serving instead of working. When we serve, whether it is toward those we love, our neighbors, or someone completely unknown to us; we are exchanging our effort, time, talents and attention toward an end. As the verse mentioned above, we are doing the will of God from the heart. We do not expect to receive back from our doing. We expect that we have already received and so our outpouring is a response, not an obligation.

There is great profit for you and for others if your labor today is serving, but there is a difference between just serving and serving the Lord. You can serve a person, a ministry, or a cause, but serving the Lord is something altogether different. Serving will affect the way you work and serving the Lord will affect how you serve.

What is the difference between serving the Lord and serving the Lord with gladness? Have you ever met someone who in their serving wasn't glad about it? I have and I may have resembled that person at different times in my own life. How you serve the Lord is very important. God tells us to "serve the Lord with gladness." In just five short words, the Bible gives us a game plan for today. When you put all three parts together (serve – the Lord – with gladness) you will find a day with purpose, delight and the blessings of God, no matter what today may bring. The action of what we do for the Lord is never as important as how we are found doing it. Thank you again for an incredible year of serving together.

Another year is flying by and fall is quickly coming to knock on our doors. Has your relationship with the Lord grown this year? Have you been able to keep up with daily devotions and study of the Word that you promised yourself back in January? I keep asking myself where 'the lazy days of summer' have gone. We started this journey together talking about ladies of great faith in Biblical times and

current day. Ladies, who strived to remain faithful even in dark days of death, tragedy and in normal everyday living when God called them to their "burning bush." Every day is another page in your faith journey even those bad hair days.

Recently, I have been studying two books "The Well-Watered Woman" by Gretchen Saffles and "Your God Is too Glorious: Finding God in the Everyday" by Chad Bird. Both books really focus on being rooted in truth and growing daily with the Lord. Instead of looking or searching for our next big event or outreach, focus on the everyday faith. Remember those women of faith we spoke about and ones we admire in our own lives. Think how their everyday faith carried them through some "big event" without that everyday faith, they wouldn't have been rooted. Maybe you are someone new to the faith. This is even more reason to get into your Bible and daily walk with the Lord. Whatever season our faith-walk, we always need the nourishment of the Word and Father.

Often our "everyday" speaks louder to those around us than those big moments. John 14:27 says "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid." In other words, "It is well with my soul" my inner being. Is it for you? Fall is my time to reflect, regroup and meditate; it can be yours too. Did your daily walk go crazy and your quiet time get to busy, too loud to hear or focus on God? Then hit the reset button like Martha who was worried about all the wrong things or the woman at the well, you too can get up and start anew. By "touching" the hem of His garment (opening His Word) your life will be forever changed, a daily renewal in a dry and parched world.

For some, their faith walk is pretty routine by now. Peace in whatever circumstance is found in their daily walk with the Lord. They continue in that steadfastness like Priscilla, who Paul calls his co-worker in Christ in Romans 16:3. Daily time with the Lord leads them to that quality so many of us admire; the dedication of seeing and being with God in the everyday. Like Joni Erickson Tada, when she feels that overwhelming feeling which she admits almost hits her as soon as she wakens because of her need for complete care by others. That first thought needs to be go to the Lord: sing His praise, dwell in His presence and find His strength for the day.

In this "Season" I challenge you to look and truly evaluate your daily walk in the everyday. Do you need to touch the hem of Jesus, to reset your walk or continue in steadfastness? Remember it was a normal day of sheep tending for Moses when God called him from a burning bush "Ordinary" days can turn into an extraordinary life.

Church & Community

At the beginning of this year, we asked you to give us a list of the community mission projects that your circle and church support. The purpose is that we could share different ministries and missions that are being implemented around the state. You ladies never cease to amaze me as to your humility and generosity in giving. During our Women's Conference in June, we displayed those missions on the wall.

There were 16 churches responded and from those 16 churches, over 107 Community Mission projects were placed on the wall. These projects are in addition to the 65 Honor Roll Churches who give faithfully to our annual Special Project, Mission Outreach Project and Scholarship Girls. These 16 churches represent only a small portion of our 201 active circles throughout West Virginia. Margy Higginbotham from Oak Hill Baptist Church stated, *"After Covid, the number of women have decreased in our women's ministry and also pushed our church attendance to where it seemed that we were dying out. But when I was working on this project for the mission wall, I realized that God is alive and well in all the things our people do for Him. We actually do more that I ever thought we did. Little is much when God is in it."*

Scholarship Thoughts



As you know the Scholarship Program is half scholarship and half loan. Upon graduation the girls are asked to repay half of the money received. The best gift we can give our girls is a zero repayment balance at graduation.

How can you do this you might ask? You can send a donation of any amount to our State Treasurer, Amy Starkey, and mark it as a repayment.

Be sure to tell Amy which girl should receive credit. Many of you may think, "How will ten or twenty dollars help?"

Let me do the math for you!! Each scholarship girl is assigned to at least 10 churches. The repayment this year is approximately \$650.00. If each church would send \$50-\$65 dollars, she owes nothing for this year. I understand that all churches cannot send \$65 dollars. If you are a larger church consider sending a little more. If you are a smaller group, send what you can. Now I am not saying that this is the only gift you can give your scholarship girl. Your ladies can do whatever their hearts desire. The girls appreciate everything you do for them.

The girls also love to get cards and notes of encouragement. I always thought it would be fun for each of the ladies in the church to write a short note in a card. Then have one person be responsible to mail out one of the cards every few weeks so that your girl is always receiving an encouraging note, a scripture thought, or just a note saying we are praying for you. Please do remember to pray for all of our scholarship recipients daily.

Each church should have received the name of their Scholarship Girl and her contact information. The names were given to the association counterparts in June. If you have not received the name of your girl, please contact Jane Mullen. Any ladies out there whose church has not been participating but is interested in communicating with one of the girls can also contact Jane. She will connect you with one of our wonderful young ladies.

Finally, start reminding the senior girls who are members of your church to apply for a scholarship. They may go online at www.wvbc.org to print an application which is due by March 1, 2024. Also, if a current recipient attends your church, remind them that they need to reapply each year. Interested girls may also contact Jane Mullen directly.
