### PROJECT GOOD SAMARITAN

What is PGS? Project Good Samaritan is modeled after the Parable of the Good Samaritan found in Luke 10:25-37.

How did PGS begin? In 1983, Rev. Roger Fairfax learned while visiting Ruby Memorial Hospital in Morgantown, that an out-of-town couple, whose baby was seriously ill, lacked money to eat. All they could afford during the child's stay were crackers, cookies, milk or soft drinks provided by the pediatric pantry. In conjunction with the social services at the hospital, several pastors, representatives of the Baptist Convention and monetary help from several churches, this program began.

What is the purpose of PGS? It is to provide a helping hand to destitute family members of hospital patients by providing a limited number of hot meals and/or initial prescriptions of patients upon their discharge from the hospital. This help is to be granted only as a "last resort" when all other avenues of financial help have been exhausted.

**How is PGS funded?** It is funded by contributions from churches and associations. If your church would like to be part of PGS, send your contributions to the West Virginia Baptist Convention through your Church treasurer.

Who needs help? My neighbor needs help. Who is my neighbor? My neighbor is anyone that is in need, not just next door, but around the world. In Luke 19:37b, Jesus said, "go and do likewise."

How do we know who is in need? The WV ABWM works closely with the Social Services personnel in several hospitals throughout West Virginia.

Why should we be involved? You are God's hands and feet in providing for someone who has exhausted all means of payment for their care in the hospital, or for purchasing prescriptions when discharged. You can provide a helping hand to the family as they travel by providing hot meals, transportation or lodging while their loved ones are in the hospital.

When and how can we get involved? You can get involved anytime! PGS is sponsored and promoted by the WV ABWM. Please feel free to call me at (304) 206-8247 to join in on this worthwhile ministry.




### WV HOPE



### DEADLINE: MARCH 1, 2024

If you have any young ladies going to college this fall or already attending college, encourage them to apply for the **ABWM of WV Scholarship/Loan.** The award is distributed as one-half as a scholarship and one-half as a loan to be repaid (interest free) after graduation. The amount varies from year to year depending on the donations given that year and the number of girls applying for a scholarship/ loan.

The scholarship/loan is unique as it includes prayer support from several churches. The Scholarship Coordinator makes the church assignments and each church decides how to provide support and maintain communication with their assigned "Scholarship Girl." Many times a church will make a donation toward the girl's loan so she will have less to repay when she graduates.

If your church has not been assigned a "Scholarship Girl," please contact me either by email or phone (listed above). If your church does not have an active women's group or your church is very small, Scholarship Girls can be assigned to individuals also.

Attending college is hard! Although the financial support is appreciated by all of our Scholarship Girls, I know they covet your prayers the most. I ask that you pray for them throughout 2024. Pray for their strength, safety and continued fellowship with Jesus. To the right is a recommended prayer schedule for you to cut out and use this year. This schedule will remind you to pray for every girl individually as well as the group a whole. Thank you!



### A New Offering for the ABWM of WV



During Women's Day 2023, the American Baptist Women's Ministries of WV voted to create a new offering called **WV Blessings**. Thirty percent (30%) of the WV Blessings offering will stay with the American Baptist Women's Ministries of WV and seventy percent (70%) will go to support the mission and ministries of the West Virginia Baptist Convention.



### How to Participate in WV Blessings

Churches that elect to collect the WV Blessings offering will send their offering to their association ABWM treasurer or directly to the state ABWM treasurer (Amy Starkey). This is the same procedure as the Mission Outreach Project and Special Project.

# FAQ's

## 1. Why are we adding a new offering?

Numerous churches have asked about an alternative to Love Gift due to increasing differences between the priorities of the national ABWM and the ABWM of West Virginia. Those differences were highlighted at the National Annual Meeting on June 23rd, where several bylaw changes were proposed that were inconsistent with the beliefs of our local women's groups. While those proposed changes did not pass, this caused many of our churches to ask for ways to better support the specific ministries they care most about.

## 2. Is this offering replacing Love Gift?

No. Love Gift will still be offered for churches that want to continue promoting that offering. WV Blessings has just been created as an alternative for those that would prefer to support local ministries.

## 3. What do we do with our Love Gift offering?

For churches that continue to collect Love Gift, you can still send that offering in through the WVBC Mission Giving Form to the WVBC office.

## **4**. How does this affect our missionaries?

The WV Blessings offering will raise the percentage of giving support to our WV missionaries to 12%, which is an increase over the approximate 1% given through Love Gift.

### Hope For Appalachia



### TUNNEL DOMES FOR AFRICA

#### 2024 MISSION OUTREACH PROJECT

Help us reach our goal of \$12,000 which would provide 24 domes with covers and/or several tree bags.



Family doctors Anita and Rick train and equip "Health Builders" to combat lifestyle-related diseases such as HIV/ AIDS, high blood pressure, heart and artery disease, diabetes, and malaria in homes, schools, places of worship, and marketplaces. Health Builders also receive training in fruit tree propagation, gardening and poultry skills to help them promote good nutrition, generate income and lead Bible study groups in their communities. Background: Doctors Rick and Anita Gutierrez have been missionaries in South Africa for 20 years. Their uses health promotion and mission disease prevention, along with capacity building primarily through agriculture to make disciples for Jesus Christ. In 2018, American Baptist women of West Virginia played a founding role in our Zachariah 3 Tree Project by donating \$10.025. With these funds, we were able to train over time approximately 100 people in techniques of propagating valuable fruit trees using "air layering." This method is relatively easy to learn, and for approximately \$1.00 worth of materials a new tree can be propagated. These trees have a vulnerable stage requiring shade for 30 to 45 days. During this time, the root system is minute and fragile. Trees at this stage are ideally kept in fiber bags, which optimizes healthy root growth for later transplantation. Additionally, the trees require securing in a triangular fashion against winds which are strong on our coastal region of Africa. While on home assignment in 2023, the Gutierrez team engaged American Baptist Women to make fiber bags for trees (\$4.65 per bag) and 60% shade cloth Dome covers (\$50 per cover).

Each year, approximately 20-30 tunnel domes are cut by hand using PVC by Rick Gutierrez. The PVC is purchased at cost in Durban, South Africa by a friendly vendor who wishes to help our mission. Each dome measures approximately 16 and three quarters feet in width, 20 feet in length, 81/2 feet in height, and covers the ground area of 271 square feet. Material costs per dome is approximately \$450.

The domes are strong, use cable ties as connectors, and could be rapidly disassembled for moving to other locations. They can be used for tree nurseries, housing of chickens, training space for health workers and bible study. The domes are assembled for local missionaries who partner with us in making disciples for Jesus Christ. They become a means of livelihood for these partners, who are living in poverty or at the edge of poverty. For this reason, we see this as a continuous part of our mission in the years going forward.
