
## mountain state MISSION OFFERING

**Baptist Campus Ministry (BCM)** has the mission of "changing lives that change the world." Since 1967, BCM has been engaging students on college campuses all around our state.

In March, the BCM Board approved the launch of a new ministry at Davis & Elkins College. With this new addition, BCM now has a presence on nine campuses. Across these campuses, there are more than 60,000 students, making BCM one of our most important outreach tools for engaging people with the gospel.

Not only does BCM provide opportunities for students to engage others locally, it also provides them with the chance to engage people around the world. Earlier this spring, 45 students went on mission trips. Fairmont State's BCM took five students to Mexico to work alongside Keith and Deborah Myers. Marshall, Potomac State and WVU sent a combined 40 students to Puerto Rico to work with the Instituto Psicopedagógico de Puerto Rico. These life-changing trips were only possible because of the partnerships of many of our WVBC churches who directly support BCM or who support them through the Mountain State Mission Offering.



Brothers' Keeper (BK) is a week-long youth mission work camp held each summer at Parchment Valley Conference Center. In 2023, BK celebrated its 23rd year by expanding beyond the Jackson County area to complete work projects in Charleston.

Over the years, more than a thousand homes have been repaired by BK participants. Last year added 40 new projects to that total, and saw 145 youth and volunteers from five different states.

In addition to work projects, participants take part in worship, Bible study, and fellowship. Last summer, five teenagers made decisions to give their hearts to Jesus at BK!



Every year, **Camp Cowen's** gates open to welcome campers of all ages and walks of life. Since 1943, Camp Cowen has been a place where people meet Jesus and grow as His disciples in a community of faith.

With three-day camps for second through fifth graders, weeklong camps for middle and high schoolers, and camping opportunities for the whole family, there is a place for everyone at Camp Cowen. The generational ministry of camp allows us to grow in faith *together*, and to live out the kingdom calling as a unified Church.

The camp theme for 2023 was Basecamp,

a dive into Psalm 23 as we learned about God, chose to trust in Him, and walked alongside one another as we grow in faith. And perhaps the biggest blessing of all, we saw 70 campers make first-time decisions to follow Jesus.
